Lesson for August 3, 2024 THE REMNANT PEOPLE HAVE A WORK TO DO

Scripture Reading: John 15. Memory Verse: John 15:8.

- 1. Has each faithful servant been assigned something to do? Mark 13:34.
- 2. What else has been given to His disciples? Matthew 25:15.
- 3. Then what are the disciples also called, to whom work has been assigned? Matthew 25:14.
- 4. What happens to each one who fails in his stewardship to bring in some increase for the Kingdom? John 15:2.
- 5. Is it necessary to have any definite connection with Heaven, for the abiding presence of the Spirit? John 15:4, 5.
- 6. What is one special requirement in order for our prayers to be heard and answered? John 15:16.

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7. What will happen to all disciples who live only in their own strength and do not constantly abide in Christ? John 15:6.

Note: The power of the gospel which brings conviction to the heart of the sinner, and gives the servant victory over himself, is acquired only through constant contact with the Savior through prayer. To cease praying is like disconnecting the generator wire on your car. Your light will soon grow dim, and finally go out.

Lesson for July 13, 2024 STEWARDSHIP

- 6. What was Jesus' response? Vs. 28-30.
- 7. If we suffer with Him, shall we also reign with Him? 2 Tim. 2:12.
- 8. Is the human mind able to comprehend what God has in store for those who love Him? Isa. 64:4; 1 Cor. 2:9.

- 10. To insure our reward, how long must we continue faithful in our labour? Revelation 2:10.

Note. We can overcome the desire for the pleasure of this old world by spending a few moments at times during the day alone with our mind on the glory of heaven, with thanksgiving and praise for a measure of victory and peace already given, as we seek for more. A magnetic power will gradually enter into your very life and soul, that will give you the complete victory over self and over everything sinful and worldly.

Note. Here we see the prophecy which had been spoken by Malachi almost four hundred years before fulfilled. The fore-runner of the Lord Jesus born, he was to go before the Saviour in the spirit and power of Elijah, to

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- 3. Will even the smallest act, if done for the Lord, be rewarded? Mark 9:41.
- 4. Will not one of the greatest joys be in seeing those for whom we have labored, saved in the Kingdom of God? 1 Thess. 2:19, 20
- 5. What promise does the Lord give us that in sowing His word, there will be results accomplished? Isaiah 55:10, 11
- 6. How much does Christ promise His laborers? Matthew 20:8.

Note. The Son of man came "not to be ministered unto BUT to minister" Matthew 20:28. It was not for Himself that He lived, though labored and died. He is our example, and we are to live and walk as He lived and walked. Our purpose and object in this short life will be to follow Him, and to live for the same work. He often spent the whole night in prayer and meditation before heaven, receiving divine charging of virtue and power by which miracles were wrought.

Lesson for August 24, 2024 PAUL, THE GREAT EVANGELIST

Scripture Reading: Acts 9:10-20. Memory Verse: 2 Timothy 4:7.

 What do we know about Paul's early life? Acts 22:3. Smith's Bible Dictionary suggests that he was probably taken to Jerusalem as a boy for his education.

NOTE: Saul means "asked, "desired". Paul means "small" or "little". These names are very appropriate to the life of the Apostle. He was desired of men, very prominent and highly trusted by the leaders. After his conversion, however, he was very humble.

- 2. Discuss the following points in the story of Paul's conversion (Acts 9). The mission to Damascus. Saul's vision. Ananias' part.
- 3. What did Paul do? Why did he leave Damascus? Acts 9:22-25.

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- part? Verse 30; John 15:1, 2.
- 6. What does this gospel, commission include? Luke 9:1, 2;
- 7. Will those who believe be able to do a great work! John 14:12.

Note: Those seeking these gifts should often read the miracles of the New Testament, and believe the promise - that they will be done again.

- 8. Are we commanded to covet the gifts of the Spirit? 1 Cor. 12:31; 14:1.
- 9. What are the gifts of the Spirit? 1 Cor. 12:8-10.
- 10. Is the Heavenly Father willing to give these good things (gifts of the Spirit) to those who seek for them earnestly? Matt. 7:7-11.
- 11. How are these gifts obtained? Matt. 7:7, 8; Luke 11:9-13.
- 12. If anyone will really hunger and thirst after these gifts, will they obtain them? Matt. 5:6.
- 13. Will the church possess these gifts in their fullness? 1 Cor. 1:5-7.

Note: Besides the gift of prophecy, which includes preaching (1 Cor. 14:3) the ministers should covet the other gifts, earnestly seeking for them.

- 4. How was he received at Jerusalem, and where did he go from there? Acts 9:26-30.
- 5. Discuss Acts 11:19-30; 12:24-25; 13:2,3.6.
- 6. Did they carry out their mission? Romans 15:25-28; 1 Corinthians 16:1-3; 2 Corinthians 8:1-5; 9:1-12.
- 7. Discuss Acts 20:22, 23; 21:10,11,33.

Note: From the day that Agabus' prophecy was fulfilled in A.D. 58, Paul was a prisoner of the Roman Empire until the year 63, at which time he was permitted to dwell in his own house (Acts 28:30). He was again arrested in A.D. 65 and beheaded in A.D. 67 or 68.

8. What have you to say about his conduct while he was under arrest?

- 5. Are we sent out to preach the Gospel? Romans 10:15.
- 6. How important is it to preach the Gospel? 1 Corinthians 9:16.
- 7. To whom should the Gospel be preached, and by what power do we preach it? Romans 1:16.
- 8. What Gospel must be preached first before Christ returns? Matthew 24:14, see also Mark 13:10.
- 9. What are we told will happen to any man that would preach another Gospel? Galatians 1:9.

Note. What a blessing it is to be a minister of the Gospel. The Bible tells us that the Father desires all His children to know Him, therefore He has

Note: Every child of God should be satisfied with his life. He should know day by day that he is fighting the good fight of faith.

- 9. Who was it that stood by Paul, giving him strength to fight the battle of life? 2 Timothy 4:17.
- 10. Was Paul the most concerned about deliverance from afflictions or from evil work? 2 Timothy 4:18.

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- 8. If we would be recognized before the Lord in the end, what must we do? Verses 32-33.
- 9. What did Jesus say He came to do? Verses 34-

Note. These are the cross roads to which everyone who will be saved must be brought to be tested as a candidate for life eternal.
