

THE CALLED, THE CHOSEN, THE FAITHFUL

It is said of those who escaped the perils of the last days, and who stand redeemed and saved before Elohim, that "they are the called, the chosen and faithful". — Rev. 17:14.

We are living in the calling time. The time when universally the great invitation call is going forth throughout the entire world. While distress and perplexities are causing men's hearts to fail them for fear, the people are admonished by the Savior that when these things begin to come to pass, they are to lift up their heads and be glad.

"Lift up your head, despondent pilgrim, Give to the wind your needless fears, He who has said redemption neareth,

Has promised to reign one thousand years".

We are called to the highest calling on earth. It is to a seat with Yahshua (Jesus), and with the redeemed of earth, and to reign in kingly or priestly authority for one thousand years. See Rev. 20th Chapter, also Rev. 5:9.

"Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the lamb is come, and his wife (the church) hath made herself ready. And to to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints. And he said unto me: Write, Blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the Lamb". — Rev. 19:7-9.

The great message of the hour is a call: "COME OUT OF HER, MY PEOPLE, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues". — Rev. 18:4.

This message of calling people out of Babylon

is spoken of also in Rev. 14:9, 10, for it is the same voice speaking from heaven, following the one that heralds the message of the fall of Babylon. In the latter place it is a special warning against worshipping the beast, with the decree that those who do so, will drink of the wine of the wrath of God (the seven last plagues, Rev. 15, 1, 7).

Babylon consists of the mother church, and her daughters. — See Rev. 17: 4, 5.

It is the church that once ruled the world with the so-called Protestant churches that have branches off from her, who have fallen. They have become abiding places for every foul spirit and cages of every unclean and hateful bird.—Rev. 18: 2, 3.

This is why the message calling the honest of heart out of Babylon is timely, and constitutes

the great message of the times.

The churches of christendom are not what they once were. It has only been a few years since prayer meetings were well attended in the church, and when people would ride for miles to attend an old fashioned house to house prayer meeting in the country districts, but now pleasure and feasting have taken the place of prayer and fastings.

In order to get an attendance at the city churches, the world has been invited into the church. You will find the poolroom, the billiard table, the card decks, and even the dancing halls in the basement of popular churches. No wonder the call to "COME OUT OF HER, MY PEO-

PLE" is a timely message.

In order to attract people to prayer meetings,

doughnuts are served, while coffee and sand-wiches are served at other places. An oyster supper is given at another and so on. We are truly living at the time of feasting which Christ said would mark the closing period of this age, and the honest of heart, the real true Christians, are disgusted with the present state and practice in the modern churches. Therefore, the message is in order to "COME OUT OF HER, MY PEOPLE". Many are responding as the invitation call to the marriage supper of the Lamb goes forth. They are coming out of Babylon, and preparing to escape the seven last plagues.

In many city churches, if a poorly dressed man enters and seats himself, he will be invited to leave, and directed to services held for such as his class. If our Messiah would enter barefoot, and in the common clothing worn in his time and place, he would be refused entrance, or in-

vited to leave.

I am informed by a leading evangelist whose business it has been to go from place to place and carry on revival meetings, that in most all city churches there is tolerated all kind of vice and sin by people who have money with which to pay the pastor and help defray the church expenses. This man said that when he went into a new place, he was requested by the local pastor not to say anything against bootlegging because so and so makes his living that way, and times were hard, and they must have his support. Also not to say anything against the dance because another person, a good supporter of the church, runs a public dance; and not to condemn the poker game because another person is much interested in it, and he is a good member; not to mention the card game, or the theatre, for similar reasons.

This particular man was himself so disgusted with present vice in the church, against which he was not free to speak, that he has resigned

his work and entered another profession.

Babylon has truly become the habitation of devils, the hold of every foul spirit, and the cage, of every unclean and hateful bird, as the Bible said it would be in the closing time.—Rev. 18:2.

The very cream of modern churches, men and women, who are praying to God for light and understanding, have awakened to prevailing sins in the church, and are seeking for a people who stand whole-heartedly for the truth and for His righteousness. It is this class who are responding to the call "COME OUT OF HER, MY PEOPLE". — Rev. 18:4.

The Chosen

God is choosing such as have a contrite heart, and who yield to His pleading voice, following the "Lamb whithersoever he goeth". God says: "They shall walk with me in white, for they are worthy". It is only by the power of the Alighty through the blessed Holy Spirit that men and women will escape from the corruption of the age, and the pollution from contact with worldly people.

The Lord gave warning by saying: "Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees". So it is today:

worldly company will affect anyone unless he prays, and thus becomes magnetized with a resistant power, and filled with divine virtue, that instead of being leavened by the worldly conversation, aspirations and desires of worldly people, he will have power with them and bring them back to God. The Lord is only choosing such to walk with Him in white.

It is only those who have a missionary zeal, and who by following the footsteps of the Master and a life of prayer, are able to overcome this present wicked world, and labor to save

others.

The Saviour says: "Many are called, but few are chosen". As the message of calling people from the confusion of Babylon goes forth, it will only be the portion of those responding to the call, who pray for the Holy Spirit, and who receive it, that will be saved. The fruits of the Spirit are "love, joy, peace", etc.

The love referred to means divine love. Everyone possesses natural human love, but the love that comes as a fruit of the Holy Spirit is the love our Heavenly Father manifested when "He gave His only begotten Son" to save the lost and wayward men and woman. It is that love that actuated Jesus when He gave His life and

shed His blood to save the lost.

It reaches throughout the countless ages and cycles of time. Christendom must be faithful if they are to be among the chosen and escape the seven last plagues and be received into the kingdom of God.

It is not necessary to produce any argument relative to the duty of every Christian in giving

themselves to save the lost. Neither is it in order to produce the many Scriptures setting for the Biblical teaching in both the Old and New Testaments on tithe paying. They are many, and it is a moral duty so firmly set forth that the Almighty called those who wilfully neglected or refused to pay the tithe, robbers, and brought great curses upon the land for this sin.

Let not one Christian be deceived by thinkink himself a Christian unless he possesses that divine love for saving the lost, that will prompt them to sacrifice in administering to their eternal needs. Even if times are hard and incomes cut down, the Heavenly Father is expecting faithfulness on the part of every one of His children. He promises to so bless the remaining portion that the giver of the tithe will be more than repaid temporally. This must not be the motive in being a faithful steward of the Lord. His great love will so incarnate our very beings that it will be a joy to sacrifice, and give ourselves freely to carry the bread of life to earth's perishing millions. Then we will be blessed a hundred fold in this life, and be among the number of the Called, the Chosen, and the Faithful, when our short race here is finished.

PRAYER SHAWLS COVER THE KHAKI AS JERUSALEMITES

JUDAH GO TO WAR KISTED DEC.

Ir the crowded Sephardi Synagogue in Jerusalem's Ramat Eshkol, a young man rose from his seat when his name was shouted from the doorway by an army courier. But his father, who was sitting next to him, held him in an embrace and refused to let him go. The synagogue's rabbi told the weeping father that his son could not stay. "His place is not here today", said the rabbi. The father released his son and the rabbi placed his hand on the young man's head to bless him.

Throughout Jerusalem, men wearing prayer shawls and skullcaps could be seen driving cars or thumbing lifts to mobilization points sometimes with knapsacks over their shouders. Some had time to stop by their homes to break their fact which become at aundown Friday.

fast which began at sundown Friday.

In a synagogue in Bayit Vegan, a rabbi interrupted services in the afternoon to tell all men in the congregation that it was permissible to break their fast if they were called up and to use motor vehicles to reach their gathering points.

In Beit Hakerem, a synagogue sexton called for silence in order to read out a list of names handed him by a courier. One of the names was that of his own son.

"A war has begun", said a rabbi in Katamon.
"Let us pray for our soldiers, may God give

them courage and protect them"

The first hint of unusual activity come before la.m. when many Jerusalemites were awakened by the sound of planes overhead. Worshippers who had gone to the Western Wall at dawn

were startled by a Phantom flying low overhead.

The streets of Jerusalem, normally deserted of vehicles on Yom Kippur, began to see traffic build up through the morning. With growing frequency, military vehicles braked to a halt in residential neighbourhoods and couriers stepped out to scan house numbers. In many instances, they were directed by neighbours to the local synagogue. Many of those called up drove their wives and children to relatives before heading, for their units.

The reaction to the mobilization was a mixture of anxiety and puzzlement. The general public had had no hint of war but the fact the mobilization was being carried out on Yom Kippur indicated that something serious was afoot. "The Arabs must have started shooting", said a man on Six Day War Street. "We never would

start anything on Yom Kippur".

Since Israel Radio does not broadcast on Yom Kippur, the country was in a total news black-out without the population knowing whether war was imminent or had actually started.

The growing uncertainty was punctuated shortly after 2 p.m. with the wail of a siren which suddeny made the situation real and, for many

people, frightening.

The siren caused many people to turn on their radios, even in religious neighbourhoods. They found that Israel Radio had indeed begun broadcasting almost simultaneously with the siren blast.

At the Western Wall, the sound of sirens sent hundreds of the worshippers in search of shelter. Many crowded into the hall beneath ancient Wilson's Arch. Others found shelter in the Jewish Quarter.

By sunset, several hundred had returned to the Wall, including the students from the Yeshivat Hakotel, who danced their way down

from the Jewish Quarter arm in arm.

The approaches to the Wall were guarded by heavy security forces. As the shofar blasts signalling the end of the holiday died away, the yeshiva students and other worshippers broke into a hora. A police loudspeaker boomed across the plaza, halting the dancers in their tracks. "Please disperse immediately to your homes", an officer said, "Happy New Year and good health to you and your families".

THE CAMP-MEETING AT JERUSALEM

In preparation for the annual camp-meeting at Jerusalem convening during the Feast of Tabernacle period, leading members of the Jerusalem church came together for the arrangement of different duties necessary for the comfort of many whom we expected to arrive. David Ohion, Elder Schlenker and Andy Dugger were placed on the lodging committees, to find and arrange many rooms for the expected ones from far and near. Sister Fern Fauth, Sister Harry Schlenker, Geraldine Dugger and Effie Dugger were assigned the work of cooking,

purchasing and preparing food.

It was decided by the board members that it would not be best to send out a letter to all the readers of "The Reporter", and to those who had finished the Bible Correspondence course in Israel, inviting them to the meeting with a promise of rooms to care for them, for fear that a thousand or more might come and it would be impossible to provide shelter and food accommodations. Therefore we placed large advertisements in two leading papers of Israel, simply announcing the feast of Tabernacles meeting, with the place and time for each meeting. These notices went out in ample time, for the meeting that was to commence on Wednesday evening, the beginning of the 15th of Ethanim, October 11th.

We had letters from ministers and others who planned to come from the United States, England, Germany, Holland, as well as other places who were coming. Our youngest daughter Mary and her husband Sammy Fauth and their four children were also coming with Elder and Sister Heuer from Washington, U.S.A.

We had a letter from Nazareth from Elder Hawkins that eleven planned to come from there. We had word from a number from Tel Aviv, Beersheba, and Haifa who planned to be here. Elder Leslie Marsh from England arrived before the war started, and he delivered

a number of rousing timely sermons.

Sabbath day October 6th, just four days before the camp-meeting was to begin, we were all assembled as usual at the house of prayer. It was a double Sabbath day, a special Holy day in Israel, when most everybody in the whole nation were fasting. More than 800 synagogues in Jerusalem, as well as thousands all over this little nation were packed with zealously praying men and women and young people. We had just concluded our meeting at the church a few minutes past 2 p.m. when the siren began to blow, which was an alarm of war. It was a shock to all of us, and to the entire nation.

Soon the news was spread through the radio, that the Egyptians were crossing the canal where they had quickly spread many bridges, and were attacking Israel with low tanks and army of 250,000 and the Syrians were attacking Israel on the north with more than a thousand tanks and tens of thousands of soldiers.

Praise and thanks to the Almighty "the Holy One of Israel", everything remained quiet in

Jerusalem, no planes were attacking and no bombs dropping, or no missels of anykind, and it has remained so, up to this writing at the close of the seventh day of the war, during which Israel has held the supremacy of the air, and none of her cities bombed, and her enemies practically overcome.

Other Arab nations, however, are threatening

to enter the war.

This has been a sore disappointment to all of us here, as well as to those planning to come to attend the camp-meeting, none of whom have been able to come, since the war began, excepting one Brother from Germany. The Lord had laid it upon his heart to come, Brother Dieter Heimke of West Germany. He miraculously obtained a seat in an overcrowded plane, filled with young Jews who had voluntarily offered their service to Israel in the war. He has been with us all through the meeting encouraging us with his presence, his testimony and otherwise.

We are having the smallest attendance we have ever had, at our camp-meetings as many have been called to the war who otherwise would have been here, and others are having to fill vital vacancies caused by those called into the war, in order to keep important public

places open.

Meetings have been conducted every day as usual, but instead of the meetings at night, the city ordered them to be held in the late afternoon, to avoid lights, in keeping with the general black-out for fear of a possible night air attack from neighboring Arab nations threatening to join the war. Radio warnings were sent out that anyone who did not shut off their lights, or paint the headlights on their car if driven at night would be prosecuted.

The camp-meeting commenced on Wednesday evening at 7 o'clock with Elder Harry Schlenker leading the singing, and Shelan Schlenker, and Priscilla Fauth at the two pianos, and Sis-

ter Harry Schlenker with an accordion.

After many songs, and a season of prayer in which a number joined with audible prayers one following the other, as well as many silent prayers, the ministers present gave short sermonetts, including Elder Leslie Marsh, Elder Harry Schlenker, and the Editor, also some tes-

timonies.

On Thursday forenoon, and afternoon meetings were held, and lunch was served under the big booth prepared according to Leviticus 23:40. Also on Friday we met at the church at the usual time, and Elder Marsh delivered the sermon in the morning, and different ones gave sermonetts, or testimonies in the afternoon meeting. On Sabbath, Elder Harry Schlenker delivered a timely sermon in the forenoon, on the need of prayer, and the receiving of the power of the Holy Spirit from Heaven, to give us victory over our own bodies, to keep us in the way of the holy Commandments, admonishing those who were not hungering and thirsting for righteousness, to pray earnestly for the

Father to give them this hunger, before it was

His sermon was followed by an altar call to which several responded, and then the whole audience knelt down at their seats, and prayed for more of the Holy Spirit in their lives. The afternoon meeting was devoted to singing, and praying, following by a short sermonett by the Editor, then the singing of choruses, with the benediction by Andy Dugger.

Shabbath was another clear sunny day and warmer than usual at this season. Sabbath school was opened by Elder Gordon Fauth with a number of good spiritual songs as usual, followed by the prayer service. Many prayer requests were presented and several offered audible prayers one following the other, while the entire congregation were on their knees joining in si-

loni prayer.

This was followed by each one rising and repeating a verse of scripture by memory. Then the scripture was read as given in the Sabbath Lesson Quarterly, Elder Fauth reading one verse and congregation the next etc. Then the children and young people led by their teachers, Sister Fern Fauth and Sister Harry Schlenker went to their rooms for the lesson period, and Brother Adolph Fauth taught the Bible class. The Bible study period was followed by songs and prayer, and then Elder Marsh from England delivered the sermon.

The meeting on Sunday was conducted as usual with Shelan Schlenker and Pricilla Fauth at the pianos and Sister Schlenker with the accordion furnished the music. Elder Donald Liedmann delivered the sermon on world conditions and Bible Prophecy. In the afternoon sermonetts were given by different ones and tes-

timonies

Monday following the general song service and prayer, the children's orchestra delivered a number of spiritual songs with guitars and other instruments. There were ten children, however, absent owing to the war, and the orchestra was small with only eight taking part.

This was followed by a short sermon by the Editor on the soon returning of our beloved Messiah, and some of the signs showing His returning to the earth was very near at hand.

Tuesday Elder Schlenker led the singing with the usual ones furnishing the music. The forenoon and afternoon meeting were devoted to prayer, testimonies, singing choruses, and short sermonetts by the ministers.

Wednesday forenoon meeting was the same as on Tuesday, only in the afternoon a group of tourists led by Elder Walter Fessele from Germany surprised us by all coming into the meeting. We were all made to rejoice, and Elder Fessele gave a short talk followed by several, wonderfully spirit filled testimonies. The Holy Spirit was as usual felt and all were made to rejoice. The meeting closed by singing choruses, and the benediction by Brother Fessele.

Then on Thursday the closing meeting of the eight days feast of Tabernacles was a joyful day. We are commanded to rejoice during this period, and eating under the booth, especially at night when we had to use candles, owing to the blackout, we were made to think of the inconvenience of the Children of Israel in the wilderness. This is the purpose of the eight days feast, lest people in their human weakness forget the wonderful miracles performed for the church at that time. They were the Father's children, whom he fed forty years with the manna from heaven. — Exodus 16th chapter.

This period of eight days eating under the booths described in Leviticus 23rd chapter, not only brings to our minds how wonderfully the Creator cared for his church, his chosen people, but it proves also that the commandments existed long before they were written on tables of stone at Sinai. This was before they had reached Sinai, and when they broke the Sabbath by going out to gather manna, it says they broke the commandments. — Exodus 16: 25 to 28.

Hence the Sabbath was one of the commandments in the law before Sinai, and this was the law kept by Abraham. — Genesis 26: 5.

He was chosen of heaven because he was found keeping all of these commandments given

by our unchangeable Creator.

The raining of the manna, and other miracles were themes of sermonetts and testimonies during the eight days eating under the booth. It was also mentioned by the Editor how the heavenly Father had again rained manna here in Israel in abundance, sold in the candy stores.

A timely sermon was given in the forenoon of the last day of the meeting by Elder Gordon Fauth, and in the afternoon by Elder Walter Fessele, followed by a short sermon by the Editor. Then the group of tourists sang a number of very timely and appropriate songs, and also with their testimonies and that of others added

much to the meeting.

Elder Harry Schlenker gave an altar call, and asked those who needed prayer to come for ward. Quite a number came forward, to be anointed, and the ministers after anointing them with oil, laid their hands on them with prayers. Then the whole congregation knelt down and prayed for more of the Holy Spirit to come upon them, for wisdom and direction from above to protect and guide them, and make them more profitable servants during the coming year.

Benediction was by Elder Fessele.



15,000 MEN, 500 TANKS OVER CANAL

WASHINGTON (Reuter). — Intelligence reports reaching the Pentagon yesterday said that an Israeli force of 500 tanks and 15,000 men is holding nearly 1,300 sq. kms. of Egyptian land.

Informed sources said that rough casualty estimates showed that the combined Arab forces have lost between 15,000 and 16,000 dead and wounded and that Israeli casualties are 3,500 to 4,000.

Arab aircraft losses are estimated at 450 planes and Israeli's at 125, the sources said. The Arabs are said to have lost 2,000 tanks and the Israelis 900 tanks and armoured vehicles.

GABON, SIERRA LEONE BREAK RELATIONS

ALGIERS (Reuter). — The West African states of Gabon and Sierra Leone announced last night they were breaking off relations with Israel. The two countries are the 23rd and 24th in Africa to break ties with Israel.

U.S. DISAPPOINTED WITH EUROPE'S RELUCTANCE TO COOPERATE


Secretary of State Henry Kissinger said yesterday the U.S. was disappointed with Europe's reluctance to cooperate in a united effort to bring peace to the Middle East.

"What concerns us is that for two weeks while the United States had to make significant decisions, the Europeans acted as though the (North Atlantic) Alliance didn't exist.

It was reported that Egypt had twelve bridges across the canal at the beginning of the war, over which around 100 thousand men and 500 tanks crossed. About 20 thousand soldiers of the Third Egyptian Army are now surrounded by the Israel army preventing them from returning.

YOU are not too young, too old, too full of aches, too fat, too thin, too anything, to have fun keeping FIT!

HOW TO GET MORE OUT OF LIFE! By Bonnie Prudden

Bonnie Pruden is a member of the President's Citizens Advisory Committee on the Fitness of American Youth. The mother of two girls, 14 and 18, she is also the director of the Institute of Physical Fitness in White Plain, N.Y., and the author of two books on physical activity: "Is Your Child Really Fit?" and "Basic Exercise No. 1".

Take a look at the members of a certain American family draped in front of the television set on a typical evening. Their bodies sag and often bulge. They nibble away at T.V. snacks. They are tired and tense — the certain harvest of a superstimulated, underexercised day.

During the day Dad had gone by car, train or bus to the office, taken an elevator, sat at a desk, and walked a few steps to lunch, where he ate too much — or too little. In the evening after a day of tension and pressure he wearily retraced his sendentary homeward path.

Mom got Dad off to the office, the kids to the school bus, "did" the house, was on the phone for the PTA, jitneyed the kids to Brownies and the piano lesson.

The kids sat in the school-bus, family car, class-room and lunch-room. At gym they had ten minutes of "on-sweat" activity.

Of course this is an exaggeration, but I suggest that you make a survey of the actual physical activity in a day in your family's life. You will find that while its members go to a great many places, they ride to most all of them and while they are engaged in a great many activities, very few are physical.

To have energy left at the end of a day you must generate, not dissipate it. A body that doesn't move deteriorates. This is true whether you are — 10, 20, or 60 years old.

In a child, inactivity results in lack of proper physical development and often he becomes fearful, fat and weak. More important, he misses the natural pleasures of childhood. Few youngsters today know the joy of walking a couple of miles on an early morning, or the fun of wading through torrential gutters. The product of overprotective parents, today's children are panicstricken if they get hurt, and sweat is something they avoid assidously.

For the adolescent, a body betraying a lack of active exercise can be tragic. A good figure is a must for girls. A boy's standing with his friend's often depends on his physical skills, his place on the team.

For the adult, a good body, which is an active body, means vitality and the ability to enjoy life. It means having the strength to meet tension-filled days and a chance to avoid the ills of inactivity: neck, shoulder ,and low back pain, headaches, and obesity. Active adults use sports and exercise as physical outlets for the constant and unavoidable irritations in their lives. And the more irritations you have, the more outlets you need to preserve your equanimity.

When you are older, a good body may not necessary mean a longer life, but can mean living longer on your own terms—being strong, good-looking, active and physically dependent on no one. What you are at 20, you can be at 40 or 50. At 60 you need only to take it a bit slower. At 70, if you are free from aches and pains, you can have a wonderful time. At any age your body can be as good as you make it.

All it takes to keep fit is determination, a little time and knowing how and what to do. The secret is simple: substitute activity for inactivity as much as you can in the course of a normal day and take a few minutes each day to do some exercises.

Give up trying to make life less physical, and make it more physical. Call up your friends and invite them to meet you for a walk after dinner. If you always take the elevator, start walking the last flight. Every few weeks add one more floor that you walk. If you're a commuter, walk to the station. Don't drive the children everywhere; make them walk. If you're a housewife, get the women in the next block to come over for an exercise session each morning. Better yet, establish a regular morning exercise time for your family.

Make up your mind that you and your family are going to get more out of life by being in good physical shape and you'll get the results that you want; a better-looking body, a better-functioning body, but most of all, more energy to enable you to get more out of life.

RAW FOOD PURIFIES YOUR BLOOD

Dr. Stewart L. Vance, publisher of the book "Nature Healer":

I had a woman call me from New York this week, that purchased a copy of the "Nature Healer" and talked a full hour. She has cancer. Wanted to know if I knew of a health place she could go to here in California.

I told her that she did not have to come out here. Just follow the book, and she could expect rapid results, as she is only 37 years old. She wanted to put off starting until after Christmas. I told her to start that minute. After Xmas it may be too late. I also told her that a personal friend, a M.D., Dr. Ford told me 26 years ago, to close my office, go home and read the paper, I had six months to live.

ORA FRANCES CARPENTER

... was born to Elder and Mrs. A. F. Dugger on February 5, 1878, near Stanberry, Missouri.

She passed away October 4, 1973, at the age of 95 years, 8 months, and 29 days. She moved with her parents at an early age to Bassett, Nebraska where she grew to womanhood.

Some of the fondest memories as a young girl were the trips she made with team and buggy with her father in his ministry of "The Church

of God", 7th day.

She lived to see many of the prophecies he preached come to pass. She taught in the rural schools of Rock County, Nebraska. To further her education she attended the State Normal College at Wayne, Nebraska.

GOLDA AT SUEZ CANAL

Prime Minister Golda Meir said yesterday that Israel did not have a surplus of friends in the world, with the U.S. being its sole supplier of vital equipment since 1970, especially since shortly after the outbreak of the present war, Israel had had no choice but to accede to America's wishes to accept the cease-fire and to facilitate the passage of supplies to the encircled Egyptian Third Army Corps.

Mrs. Meir said this during a tour of Sinai and the Israeli frontlines here, accompanied by Defence Minister Moshe Dayan, Minister Yisrael Galili, and Chief of Staff David Elazar.

She said the decision had gone against Israel's grain, but it had been altogether clear that the U.S. would not take special delight in receiving a negative reply from us, so the Cabinet sat up all night and decided what it had. "What had been asked of us was unjust, but that's the situation", Mrs. Meir said.

She said — with a slight touch of sarcasm in her voice - that Israel's war experience has always been that when things are not going well for us, no one is stirred to propose a cease-fire: only when things are going badly for our enemies everybody is suddenly aroused.

"SOVIET THREATENED TO DESTROY ISRAEL"

NEW YORK (Reuter). — The Soviet Union



threatened the "destruction of the State of Israel" by Russian troops unless Israel stopped violating the Middle East cease-fire last week, "Time" magazine said yesterday.

"Time" said the threat was contained in a secret note sent to President Nixon by Soviet Communist Party Chief Leonid Erezhnev.

The contents of the note have not been revealed by the White House but Senator Henry Jackson (D. Wash.) earlier describes its contents as "brutal".

'Instead of beginning in the usual diplomatic salutation 'Dear Mr. President', it started out with a harsher 'Mr. Nixon'," "Time" said.

Syrian President Hafez Assad said last night Egyptian President Anwar Sadat assured him that the Soviet Union had given Cairo "guarantees" of an Israeli withdrawal to the June 4, 1967 frontiers.

Shalom!

We extend greetings of peace to you and to all of our friends who are concerned about what is happening in the Middle East. We are thankful for your prayers, and for the sustaining hand of the Father above, who is also concerned about

His land, and His people.

Many things have happened since we wrote the last letter. Yom Kippur (Day of Atonement) came on Sabbath this year. It is supposed to be the most sacred day of the year in Israel, on which they fast (afflict their souls). We always fast too, and pray for Israel. We believe that some day soon they will look on him whom they pierced and "mourn for him as one mourneth for his only son". — Zechariah 12:10.

"Every family apart and their wives apart". We walked to meeting that day. There was not one car on the street. The Arab buses from the Old City were not running either. The Arabs in Israel respect this the most holy day in Israel.

About the time the meeting was dismissed, we heard the siren blowing, and some people told us there was a war started in Sinai and Syria. It was a time of distress and mourning in Israel to have to send their young sons to fight an unexpected war, and perhaps to give their lives to save Israel. Golda Meir said: "Israel is fighting for her existence", which was true. Ever since that day two and a half weeks ago

Ever since that day two and a half weeks ago there has not been a cloud in the sky. It seems the Almighty is waiting to see how the nations are going to treat Israel, as Israel goes from vic-

tory to victory over her enemies.

My husband told me it was time to write my piece for the December paper. Two scriptures have been ringing in my ears, two scriptures that my husband has been bringing before the attention of different congregations where he

has preached over the years.

Ezekiel 36: 9 to 11, speaking of the mountains of Israel: "For behold I am for you and I will turn unto you and you shall be tilled and sown. And I will multiply upon you men and beast, and they shall increase and bring fruit, and I will settle you after your old estates, and will do better unto you than at your beginning, and ye shall know that I am the Lord".

Also Micah 7: 15, 16: "According to the days of thy coming out of the land of Egypt will I show unto him marvelous things. The nations shall see and be confounded at all their might. They shall lay their hand upon their

mouth, their ears shall be deaf".

We should all rejoice that the Almighty is leading His people, and is restoring them in their rightful place, even in Jerusalem, but some of their enemies still insist that they should go back to their borders they had before the 1967 war. They may try to implement the 242 Resolution as they interpret it without any agreement of peace.

Some think that the cease-fire will lead to more war. We think that Ezekiel 38th chapter is approaching. The Almighty is leading.

On October 24th "The Post" reported that the first cease fire had not been kept. Later news said that a new cease-fire had been put in force with the U.N. as a guard. We will see if all will co-operate. Terrorists in Lebanon have been sending over shells and rockets against civilian targets. One of our grand-sons was visiting a boy friend in Nazareth. He said they had to stay in bomb shelters quite a lot of the time, but here in Jerusalem there was nothing like that going on, and now that the cease-fire is in effect there is no need to black out our windows even.

Brother and Sister Heuer and our daughter and family were not able to come as we expected, and we received no mail for about two weeks until the cease fire came. We surely enjoyed the Feast of Tabernacles, although many who expected to come could not be here owing to the war. The city officials requested that no night meetings be held and that instead they should meet about 4 o'clock to be over before time for lights to go on.

October 28th. Planes and mail from the U.S. are coming again, and we hope that Elder and Sister Heuer and our daughter Mary and family

will come.

October 29th. The 2nd cease fire is still holding but Israel is still protesting about not receiving the names or whereabouts of the prisoners held by the enemy. Also Israel insists that the U.N. force stationed here should all be from countries who still hold diplomatic relations with Israel.

Let us pray that all hindrances to a just and lasting peace may be removed according to the Almighty's will.

QUESTION. —

Are there many Christian Missions in Israel, and do they accomplish results in converting the

ANSWER. —

There are many missionaries here from various church organizations, but most of them keep the days of the sun, handed down through Babylon from the sunworshippers, and I am sorry to say also that most of them take sides with Rome, that Jerusalem should be an international city controlled by the U.N., and not the capital of Israel. 



EGYPT ASKED FOR TRUCE, HERZOG SAYS

It can be assumed that Egypt, facing an imminent military disaster, asked Soviet Premier Kosygin to bring about a cease-fire — the military commentator, Aluf (res.) Haim Herzog, said in his evening broadcast yesterday.

He noted that the most interesting aspect of the past week's developments was the almost unprecedented urgency with which the Russians acted. "The Kremlin correctly assessed the military situation and what was likely to happen if it were allowed to deteriorate", he said.

Mr. Kosygin rushed to Cairo on October 15, two days after the massive Egyptian offensive along the eastern bank of the Canal had been broken, and held five meetings with President Sadat. That was the same day that Israeli bridgehead was established on the western bank, the commentator pointed out.

From Israel's point of view, Aluf Herzog said,

continuation of the fighting would have resulted in more territorial gains for Israel, "but at the cost of more of our sons' lives". In any case, the war had now been taken out of its local context.

"With both the U.S. and the Soviet Union now agreed on a common line of action, the combatants are left with little room for manoeuvring", he concluded.

VULNERABLE

Despite all the talk about electronic countermeasures against the Sam missiles, the officer believed that tanks had proven themselves the most effective anti-missile weapon. The missile batteries are vulnerable and a couple of tank shells hitting either the missiles themselves or their radar and control systems could put the whole battery out of action. As for their crews—for the most part—they just ran away and Israeli troops found the missile sites deserted.

HOLLAND SUGGESTS "INTERNATIONAL UMBRELLA" FOR JEWISH EMIGRANTS

THE HAGUE. — Holland is in contact with other European countries about the possibility of creating an "international umbrella" for the protection of Jewish emigrants from the Soviet Union, according to Dutch Prime Minister Joop den Utyl.

"Our view is that emigration must and can continue", den Uryl said. "And we are weighing various possibilities but I cannot tell you

what they are.

300 IMMIGRANTS ARRIVED FROM THE SOVIET UNION

About 300 immigrants from the Soviet Union arrived at Lod on the eve of Yom Kippur, bringing the number of arrival since Austria said it would close the castle to 1,000, a record for a week.

3,000 BUSES CARRY 1.5 MILLION

TEL AVIV. — Egged has planned to run more than 3,000 buses on Wednesday and on Saturday night, last week, to cope with about 1.5 million travellers expected on the Rosh Hashana holiday. The company's entire fleet was on the roads, a spokesman said.

Internal urban bus transportation stopped between 4 and 4.30 p.m. Buses started running again on Saturday night at about 6.10 p.m.

El Al placed a number of planes at the Agency's disposal for the operation including a Jumbo Jet which arrived with 350 immigrants. Normally, about 100 immigrants arrive from Vienna daily.

Many thousand visitors were caught in the war and could not leave. Jerusalem was crowded, but everything moved normally, only most

buses were carrying soldiers to the front.

MORE IMMIGRANTS CAME BY TRAIN LAST WEEK

A Jewish Agency official said in Jerusalem last night that Soviet immigrants continued to arrive in Austria by train and that they had been sent to Shoenau in the usual way.

"Whatever the Austrian Government has decided", he said, "they have not yet put it into practice". A plane with 150 Soviet immigrants from the Shoenau camp was due at Lod at 5 a.m. last week. None of the immigrants on the

hijacked train were on the plane.

The astonishment of top Jewish Agency officials at the Austrian decision was due largely to the long history of assistance by the Viennese authorities to Jewish immigration to Israel. Hundreds of thousands of immigrants from Eastern Europe have passed through various transit camps in Austria during the last two decades.

The Shoenau camp, leased almost a decade ago, became the main transit camp for the large-

scale Soviet emigration which began two and a half years ago. In all, about 100,000 immigrants have passed through Shoenau, including almost all of the 70,000 Soviet immigrants.

MIXED MARRIAGE AMONG SOVIET JEWS

NEW YORK. (INA). — Mixed marriages among Soviet Jews rose to over 31 per cent in the period 1966 to 1972. This was revealed last week in a study commissioned by the National Federation of Jewish Welfare Boards.

The study also found that 9.2 per cent of all married American Jews are married to non-

lews.

TOGO BREAK WITH ISRAEL

The West African state of Togo has broken its diplomatic ties with Israel — the seventh African state to do so since February 1972. The Foreign Ministry in Jerusalem announced the break last Friday with "regret and bitter dismay".

"It is strange", the Ministry spokesman observed, "that a sovereign state which has maintained bilateral relations with Israel in which no problems have arisen, should have submitted to

outside pressures in this manner".

EGYPT-SOVIET BID TO IMPROVE TIES

CAIRO (UPI). — President Sadat met with Soviet Ambabssador Vladimir Vinogradov last week to discuss steps to restore Soviet-Egyptian relations to their "former cordial state" political sources said.

Viongradov called on Sadat — by previous arrangement — at the residence at Borg el Arab, near Alexandria, where the Egyptian President

has been staying all week.

The meeting followed an exchange of lengthy letters between Sadat and Soviet Communist Party leader Leonid Brezhnev. The first news of these letters appeared in the Cairo newspaper "Al Ahram" last weekend.

SHEPHERDS LIVED ON THE GOLAN 5,000 YEARS AGO

The first reliable evidence that the Golan was inhabited by shepherds and farmers some 5,000 years ago has been turned up in an excavation carried out north of Ramat Hamagshimim, the Government Antiquities Department reported yesterday.

Below the tumble of fallen stones was found a rectangular house comlpex dated by a rich variety of finds to the second half of the fourth

milleneum BCE.

The site is along the route of a new road that is being constructed through an upland plateau

dotted with stone-heaps.

Dr. Claire Epstein, of Ginossar, headed the dig which was carried out last month on behalf of the Antiquities Department, with the help of the army and with the financial assistance of the Government Public Works Department.

Large Courtvard

The well-built walls of the house, some 70 cms. in width, were found standing to a height of a metre. Two rooms - both in all probability originally roofed, perhaps with skins and branches - give on to a large open courtyard.

On low shelves and on the floor were found pottery fragments of large bins and storage jars used for liquids and grain, as well as basalt bowls, mortars and pestles and agricultural

tools.

MOSCOW DENOUNCES PEKING

Almost on the eve of the summit meeting of 74 non-aligned nations, due to open in Algeria on September 5, the Soviet Union has stepped up its verbal and written attacks on China, culminating in a vicious denunciation of China's leaders. They were accused, among other things, of seeking to dominate Asia with their nuclear might.

In recent months there has been an exchange of bitter accusations and much recrimination between Peking and Moscow. The two nations are more highly suspicious of each other than ever following the separate approachment of both

with the United States.

In both capitals there are elements who have not acquisced in the more friendly ties with Washington, and who fear that the only advantage in the present circumstances will be for the

MART EXPERIMENT WITH NEW UNIFIED EUROPEAN CURRENCY — EURCO

BRUSSELS (AP). - Common Market authorities have set their seal of approval on the "Eurco", an experiment in a unified European currency devised by the European Investment Bank and the Rothschild Bank in London.

Rothschild is issuing a loan of 30 million Eurcos for the bank. The Investment Bank involved in the currency is a Common Market body.

> FINED FOR INCREASING WASHING MACHINE PRICE

TEL AVIV. - A local appliance store and its manager were fined a total of IL18,000 in the Magistrate's Court here for selling washing machines at a price higher than the fixed one.

Central Salon of 32 Rehov Ben Yehuda sold 10 machines for IL2,500 instead of the fixed

price of IL2,250.

The shop was fined IL15,000 and the manager, Tuvia Nadav, IL3,000. The charges were brought by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

CITRUS EXPORT SEASON BEGINS

HAIFA. - The citrus season began here on Friday when the British freighter m.s. Mendip Prince sailed for Britain with 25,000 cases of grapefruit.

The start of the season was advanced to a date earlier than usual as part of the Citrus Marketing Board's efforts to spread exports over as long a period as possible.

The early ripening grapefruit from the Jordan Valley were tested for sugar and juice content and found to be "excellent"

Export shipments will continue this week and five more shipments totalling 250,000 cases of grapefruit are due to be sent from Haifa port. The Board's plans call for a total export of 51 to 52 million cases this year, eight million more than last year, when frosts caused heavy damage to orchards.

"BIGGEST SOVIET NUCLEAR TEST IN SEVEN YEARS"

UPPSALA, Sweden. - The seismological institute here yesterday registered what it described as the biggest underground nuclear blast from the Novaya Zemlaya area of the Soviet Union in seven years.

The explosion, at 7 a.m., registered 7.1 on the Richter Scale, which is equivalent to several me-

gaons, the institute said.

An official said this was the largest blast ever recorded from the Soviet nuclear test region since observations were first taken from here in 1966.

Military sources said the tests are believed to be connected with the development of multiple nuclear warheads and warheads for anti-ballistic

missiles.

The so called "doomsday bombs", tested in the Arctic area in the 1960s, measured up to 50 megatons and more. They were exploded in the atmosphere, sending radioactive waste across Northern Europe and into Asia. These tests were abandoned in connection with the test ban agreement, banning all atmospheric tests.

JEWISH SETTLEMENT HISTORY ON SHOW

TEL AVIV. — The story of 100 years of Jewish village settlement in Israel will be shown at the Exhibition Grounds here next week. According to the organizers, over IL10m. has been put into the exhibition which will portray settlement from the time of the Billuim, through the Second Aliya up to the present day. Among the most important exhibits will be water development, the kibbutz and the moshav. Half a million visitors are expected during the three weeks that the exhibition will remain open.

The official opening by the Prime Minister and Agriculture Minister Haim Gvati will be next

Wednesday.

ANTI-ISRAEL DRIVE IN E. GERMANY

TEL AVIV. — Following its recent past signed with the Arab terrorists, East Germany has unleashed a violent hate campaign against Israel.

The pact signed with Yasser Arafat provides for 'full military political and other forms of

assistance in its fight against Israel".

The East German Government then even went one step further by publicly declaring the solidarity of its people in the "joint battle"

SYRIAN REFINERY DESTROYED

HOMS .— Israeli aircraft destroyed a major power station and put a still-blazing oil refinery

out of action for years to come during raids on this central Syrian town, officials said here yesterday.

I saw a great pillar of black smoke and flames rising from the wrecked oil refinery more than 24 hours after the last Israeli bombing at-

tack on Wednesday.

Experts said 80 per cent of the £20 m. refinery was destroyd and it would not be in operation again for several years. Annual production at the refinery was estimated at one million tons.

The power station produced a fifth of Syria's electricity supplies. The director of the plant said at least 30 of his 450 workers were killed

and about 100 injured.

Rescuers were unable to approach the inferno of flames and explosions that the oil refinery had become. (Reuter).

TERRORIST FIRES BAZOOKA SHELL NEAR HADERA

A bazooka shell exploded harmlessly in a field outside the settlement of Tsur Natan near

Hadera, on Sunday night.

Security forces searched the area and discovered that the bazooka had been fired electronically from a rock in the general direction of the settlement.

JERUSALEM TREES WILL SURROUND HER

Some 250,000 trees are to be planted in and around Jerusalem each year, according to the Jewish National Fund. A total of 12,000 dunams are to be planted around the new housing developments to the north, east and south. These will eventually link with the Jerusalem Forest to the west of the city to form an almost continuous green belt.

Since the war, 1,100 dunams have been planted. The pace is to be speeded up so that 1,000

dunams are planted each year.

WOUNDED SOLDIERS INTERVIEWED

The first wounded back from the fronts described yesterday how they broke their Yom Kippur fast by eating battle rations as they

moved forward into combat.

Three young soldiers interviewed at Hadas-sah Hospital all said they and most of their comrades had fasted at least until the enemy attack began Saturday at 2 p.m. Some front-line soldiers continued to fast until sundown when Yom Kippur was over despite an announcement by the Military Rabbinate that the obligation to fast was waived with the outbreak of fight-

Soldiers who fought on the Suez spoke of night-time Egyptian ambushes and stiff fighting. A 20-year-old second-lieutenant told how his tank was hit by bazooka fire and set on fire about five kilometres west of the canal as he led two other tanks towards the front line about

midnight Saturday.

"The tank was disabled but I put the fire out. The Egyptians fired a flare and I saw the enemy soldiers. There were many. I'd say a company. They were lying in a line in front of low

sand dunes".

The tank's cannon was still working and the lieutenant opened fire on the Egyptians from about 300 yards. When the second tank in line came up behind him, he changed tanks with its commander and ordered the driver to charge directly at the enemy commandos with the third tank providing covering fire. As he reached the

Egyptian line, his tank was hit simultaneously by four bazooka shells and the lieutenant, who was standing exposed in the turret, fell wounded into the tank. He yelled at the driver to turn left so as to run along the length of the enemy line. "Crush them", he shouted. "Crush them".

The lieutenant, who has been wounded in the hand an right shoulder, realized that his injuries were not grave and climbed back into the turret. He saw Egyptians running away as close as three meters away and opened fire with his Uzi. When the Egyptians attempted to reorganize he opened fire with the tank's canon and scored hits. He was shortly afterwards evacuated to a rear aid station.

Another ambush, this one staged by the Egyptians from their own bank of the canal, was described by a 22-year-old gunner. His unit began moving towards the canal from a rear position Saturday afternoon. Although ordered at 3 p.m. to break his fast, the red-headed gunner, a sergeant, did not eat until 4 p.m. when a heavy Egyptian barrage made it seem a sensible thing to do. "Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur are holidays I respect".

His ammunition loader, he said, did not get to eat before he was wounded midnight Saturday since he had wanted to wait until sundown before breaking his fast and by that time he was in combat and too busy to eat. "He was

almost dehydrated", he said.

The sergeant was in the lead tank as the unit approached the canal at 10 p.m. About a kilometre from the waterline, it was suddenly struck

by a tank-to-tank rocket dubbed the Shmil. It was fired by an Egyptian tank perched atop one of the lofty ramps built by the Egyptians on their side of the canal.

In the ensuing battle, however, the sergeant's new tank was hit by three rocket. He escaped from the burning vehicle whose ammunition be-

gan exploding.

"We were told before Yom Kippur started that we could expect something big. They explained to us it was a political problem and we would just wait for the attack. But I didn't expect it to come on Yom Kippur itself."

16TH AFRICAN STATE BREAKS ISRAEL TIE

BANGUI (Repter). — The Central African Republic has decided to break off diplomatic relations with Israel, President Jean-Bedel Bokassa said in a radio broadcast yesterday.

"SATELLITES AID ARABS"

NEW YORK (Reuter). — The magazine "Aviation Week", reported here that Russian reconnaissance satellites over Midde East battle areas are helping the Soviet Union advise Egyptian and Syrian military commanders on tactics against Israel.

The magazine said one of these satellites was taken out of orbit on October 10, ahead of schedule and replaced by a second whose orbit provides good coverage of the combat zone.

The magazine predicted that the U.S., "caught without an effective big bird up at the time the war erupted", would hastily launch a satellite.

The Defence Department refused to comment on the report.

TANK LIEUTENANT ESCAPES BY PLAYING POSSUM FOR 25 HOURS

A young Israeli tank lieutenant, surrounded by Egyptian soldiers who thought he was dead, played possum for 25 hours and then crawded to his lines under cover of darkness.

The lieutenant, who got back fighting with his unit, said the Egyptians stripped him of a gold chain hanging around his neck, took his identity disks and emptied his pockets. Finally an Egyptian soldier, unnerved by the "corpse's" blackbearded face, covered it with a sack.

"When the Egyptians launched their big counter-offensive in the central sector of the Canal last Sunday, we were ordered to break through the enemy troops who were dug in", the lieutenant said.

"We moved in a column along the road. The first tank was hit by a missile. A kilometre farther, a missile hit the rear of my turret. I was flung 10 metres from my tank and lost

consciousness.

"When I came to, I found myself lying in a trench occupied by dozens of Egyptians. I saw their yellow helmets and their faces. They were firing missiles at our tanks. I closed my eyes again so they wouldn't notice I was alive. A few hours later an Egyptian soldier covered me with a dirty sack. It seems my

sooty face unnerved him".

The officer went on to say that towards evening the Egyptians finally picked him up and heaved him out of the trench. "I didn't dare move a muscle. I knew that if they found out I was still alive they would shoot me. I thought of my parents... of my friends in the army. I was parched with thirst...

"As soon as it got dark I started to crawl. The Egyptians didn't notice. I was sorry I didn't have any grenades on me. I crawled over to one of our disabled tanks. I found a jerrycan of water and drank some. I ate some battle rations I found inside the tank. Then I must have fallen asleep. Awaking at dawn, I saw some of our soldiers about 700 metres away. I waved to them. One of them came up to me.

"'What's your name', I asked him. 'Michael', he said. 'You're Michael the Archangel', I told him."

FOOD EXPORTS GOING TO EUROPE BY AIR

TEL AVIV. — With refrigerated ships cutting their calls at Israel ports, all of the country's exports of produce are being sent to European markets by El Al, according to Moshe Shavit, General Manager of Agrexco.

The exports include eggplant, avocados, carp, goose liver, day-old chickens and flowers.

LEMON SHIPMENTS LEAVE FROM ASHDOD

ASHDOD. — The first citrus consignment 30,000 crates of lemons — left here for Europe at the end of last week. The director of the port, Yitzhak Gazit, said that while the port management has not yet received a forecast of citrus expected to move through Ashdod in the immediate future, any large-scale export of fruit is bound to cause serious problems.

Meanwhile, eight ships arrived at the port on Friday, and 21 stevedore crews are busy loading and off-loading their cargoes according to a scale of priorities determined by a special committee. Mr. Gazit praised the spirit of the port workers who are making efforts to keep the port operating around the clock. He also thanked those importers who have removed their consignments from the congested port warehouses. The warehouses are still very crowded, he said, urging, importers who have not yet removed their goods to do so so as soon as possible.



CEASE-FIRE IS "RESULT OF ISRAEL"
MILITARY GAINS"

PARIS. — The newspaper "Le Figaro" said yesterday that the Middle East cease-fire was the immediate and direct consequence of the military gains of the Israelis.


DEFENCE MINISTRY OFFERS HELP TO FAMILIES OF FALLEN
